# Event on par to fight cancer

Deb Duffield has a simple reason for organizing the second annual Golf For A Cure tournament Friday at Grand Valley Golf & Country Club.

"I want to make cancer history," said Duffield, subscription supervisor at the *Cambridge Times* and main organizer of this year's fundraiser.

Last year, the *Cambridge Times* Golf For A Cure raised \$8,000 for the Canadian Cancer Society. This year, the *Times* has teamed up with Cambridge Golf & Fashions and is hoping to raise \$15,000.
